On the 25th of Sept. 1804, the U.S. Frigate Constitution, commanded by Isaac Hull, Esq. was engaged with the British Frigate Curriere, commanded by James R. Dacres, Esq. The Constitution was victorious, and the Curriere was captured. The Constitution was damaged, but not disabled. The Curriere was captured, and the crew was taken on board. The Constitution returned to New York on the 27th of Oct. 1804.

At the capture of the Curriere, the crew of the Constitution were divided into two parties, one to take possession of the Curriere, and the other to remain on board the Constitution. The Curriere was captured, and the crew was taken on board. The Constitution returned to New York on the 27th of Oct. 1804.
